## **ABSTRACT**

In 2010 the Historic House Trust of New York City established the Archaeology Advisory Board to improve and consult on archaeological work done at the twenty-three houses within the Trust. With a great deal of archaeology having taken place at many of the houses the first step to improving the archaeological system, is that all information pertaining to archaeology at the houses be organized and easily accessible. This will make future archaeological efforts more effective and create a more richly informative history of the houses.

## **INTRODUCTION**

In February 2010, the Historic House Trust of New York City employed Ashley Bettis, as an intern, to gather all documentation of archaeology that has occurred at the houses within the Trust's collection. The goal was to attain a "Master List" of all the aforesaid documentation, along with copies of the documents. These documents were then to be organized digitally with the prospect of creating an online database to store such information in the near future.

## **DOCUMENTATION**

The process of finding documentation involved many resources. Over the course of this project three hundred and twenty documents were collected, with the Historic House Trust having only seventy prior to the project. It was through correspondence and visits with the employees of the houses, the Landmarks Preservation Commission, the New York Public

Library, archaeologists and other specialists (See References), that the other two hundred and fifty were obtained.

A Master List was created that lists each document by “House,” “Title,” “Document Type,” “Date,” and “Author.” The List also includes notes about the document, the location where a hard copy can be found, and whether the document was made into a digital file. See Figure 1 in the Appendix for a copy of the Master List. Documents that were digitized (total 2.07GB in size) and are saved in a folder on the Historic House Trust’s computer drive.

After completing the Master List and uploading the documents into digital files, the information was used to create rough “Maps of Archaeological Excavations” where archaeology had generally occurred for each house and its surrounding area. The last two columns of the Master List account for these maps. The former, “to be mapped?” column indicates whether the document was used in the creation of the maps. The latter, “map number,” gives each document a number linking it to its project area in its respective map. For example, if a report on archaeology at Bartow-Pell Mansion has a map number of 4, then the Bartow-Pell Map of Archaeological Excavations designates the area detailed in that report with a number 4. The maps were uploaded into a file on the Historic House Trust’s computer drive and total 4.77MB in size. See Figures 2 to 11 in the Appendix for copies of these maps. In the near future these rough maps will be converted to the computer program CAD so that they can be updated as needed.

## **CONCLUSION & RECOMMENDATIONS**

It is the suggestion of the author that Phase 2 of this project be the creation of an archaeological database for reference to all archaeology past, present and future that occur at any



of the houses within the Trust. When such a database is created, it should account for the various types of documents that have been digitized. For a suggested organization of the documents see Figure 12 in the Appendix. It would also be prudent to organize that data by Borough, House, Title, Date, and Author.

Once a database has been created, it will be a useful tool to many facets of the archaeological process for the Historic House Trust. It will allow the user to research archaeological work relative to specific houses as well individuals involved with and procedures taken in the process of archaeology at the houses. It will also allow the user to determine areas of potential sensitivity and those that have been exhausted.

At present, the houses that documentation has been accounted for are; the Alice Austen House, the Bartow-Pell Mansion, the Conference House, the Dyckman Farmhouse, Historic Richmond Town, King Manor, Kingsland Homestead, the Lott House, Merchant's House Museum, Morris-Jumel Mansion, Queens County Farm Museum, Van Cortlandt Manor, and the Wyckoff House. There have been a few houses for which archaeological documentation could not be found, usually due to the house having been moved from its original location. The houses for which documentation could not be found are; the Bowne House, Edgar Allen Poe Cottage, Lefferts Historic House Museum, Lewis H. Latimer House, Little Red Lighthouse, Old Stone House, Seguin Mansion, Swedish Cottage Marionette Theatre, and the Valentine-Varian House.

The following is a chart listing the houses, whether or not documentation is present, and what if any areas are thought to be potentially sensitive. After this chart is a summary of some of the archaeological work done at the house, the findings of the work, and any recommendations specified in reports.

### Alice Austen House

The Alice Austen House's sensitivity report from 1990, entitled "Archaeological Investigations," by Peter Gisolfi Associates, points to various areas of sensitivity in the surrounding area of the house. At present, there is no known archaeological work that has

occurred on the site. The sensitivity report notes that there is “potential archaeological sensitivity throughout [the Alice Austen Park].”(Peter Gisolfi Associates, p.74) It also claims that the area south of Hyman Boulevard is “of particular concern regarding prehistoric or early contact Native American sites or artifacts and historical structures now or once standing.”(Peter Gisolfi Associates, p.74) There is also a map within the report, Exhibit 47, entitled “Archaeological Sensitivity Model.” It points to the McFarlane-Bredt House and the “Site of Wharf/Bulkhead” as having “Possible Pre-historic (Native American) Sensitivity.”(Peter Gisolfi Associates, p.79) The map also points to areas of “Potential Historical Sensitivity” including; the McFarlane-Bredt House, Greenhouses, Site of Wharf/Bulkhead, Site of Gardener’s Cottage. (Peter Gisolfi Associates, p.79)

### **Bartow-Pell Mansion**

The Bartow-Pell Mansion has had various archaeological monitoring and work done in the areas surrounding it. The work done included the carriage house, monitoring of the path leading from the main drive to the west side of the mansion, fence line and septic field monitoring, monitoring of the underground electric line installation between the carriage house and the mansion, and the nearby Bartow Cove site (See Figure 2).

During excavations of the carriage house site, nothing was found that could “confidently be assigned to the residents of the estate between c. 1840 and 1888.”(Historical Perspectives, p.62) Excavations of the “path project” also found “no significant stratigraphic levels or in situ cultural resource materials.”(Chrysalis Archaeological Consultants, Inc., p.08) The area had been previously disturbed by past path construction, and was not at a significant depth, 2 feet.

The project area of the septic field was also found to be of “negligible archaeological significance.”(Schuldenrein, p.4) A refuge and burning site was found in the south side of the



leach field and contained a mix of historic bottles and bricks, but the findings were dominated by remains from the 20<sup>th</sup> century.

The monitoring of the electrical utility trench also did not uncover any significant archaeological deposits or features. There were artifacts found under the porch of the mansion, but they could not be related to “a specific historic occupation of the Bartow-Pell Mansion property.”(Louis Berger and Associate, Inc., p.9)

At the Bartow Cove site, located about 300 yards Northeast of the rear of the Bartow Pell Mansion, a dig in 1958 uncovered a shell midden and other Native American artifacts such as arrow heads, bones, and vessel shards. They also found a child’s burial. In 1965, in the same area, Edward J. Kaeser found stone tools. (Kaeser, p.1)

### **Conference House**

The Conference House, Conference House Park, and surrounding are highly archaeologically sensitive. For the purposes of this paper, only areas in the immediate vicinity of the Conference House will be discussed. (For further information on the further areas in the Park, such as the Biddle House, see the reports cited in Figures 3 and 4) From 1979 to 1980; Sharene Baugher, Edward J. Lenik, Robert W. Venables, Kate T. Morgan, and Judith M. Guston all participated in a study of the area. Their investigations in the yards surrounding the Conference House historic artifacts, but also believe that there are possibly prehistoric artifacts in the area as well. The most intact historic deposits were within 5 feet of the house. They believe that the yard on the east side of the building may contain 18<sup>th</sup> century wells, privies, and outbuildings.

### **Dyckman Farmhouse**

Cultural monitoring of infrastructural improvements at the Dyckman Farmhouse in 2007 “no intact, stratigraphic and/or archaeological material cultural level(s) were

uncovered.”(Chrysalis Archaeological Consultants, Inc., p.15) Material remains that were found were disturbed, but it is suggested that future archaeological work may uncover intact findings.

During Linda Stones archaeological testing of the Dyckman Farmhouse Park in 2003, she found a variety of ceramic shards dating from the early 1700’s through the present which she believes to be deposited over time. Despite limited findings, she is also in favor of continued archaeological research in the area.

In the early 20<sup>th</sup> century, Reginold Pelham Bolton conducted early “archaeological” digs in the area surrounding the Dyckman Farmhouse. His study uncovered various artifacts and features (such as Hessian Huts) of the Revolutionary War. The area, which was primarily open land at the time, has since been developed. His findings however, do indicate the archaeological potential of the land that is left intact at the site of the Dyckman Farmhouse.

### **Gracie Mansion**

In the 1980’s, an archaeological investigation took place in the basement, and the surrounding area of Gracie Mansion. The findings included various historic remains which are currently housed at the Mansion. Due to the absence of a final report, all that is known about the excavation is from a series of field notes (For a list of the notes see Figure 1).

### **Historic Richmond Town**

Various archaeological studies and investigations have taken place at Historic Richmond Town which uncovered historical feature and artifact remains. The area remains sensitive.

### **King Manor**

A great deal of archaeological activity has occurred at King Manor, from monitoring to intensive studies. The most recent and detailed analysis is by Christopher Matthews who conducted an archaeological investigation from 2004 to 2006 at King Manor. There were a



wealth of artifacts and features uncovered during this study. King Manor is a highly sensitive area. For details on findings see “Draft Report of 2004-2006 Archaeological Investigations at the Rufus King Manor Site” by Christopher N. Matthews.

### **Kingsland Homestead**

There is a sensitivity report for Weeping Beech Park which notes that the area has a potential for sensitivity, but that 25% of the land has been destroyed due to ground disturbances. The type of remains expected to be found would be from Dutch and English colonial times to the present. The report also includes a map of areas believed to be of high archaeological significance and recommends monitoring of any future development in these areas (Pagano, p.A15).

### **Lott House**

For over a decade the Brooklyn College Archaeological Field School, under the direction of archaeologist H. Arthur Bankoff have been conducting excavations at the Lott House. A wealth of material culture has been discovered ranging from the 17<sup>th</sup> century to the 20<sup>th</sup> century.

### **Merchant’s House Museum**

In the 1990’s three small scale excavations of the Merchant’s House Museum backyard were conducted by the City College of the City University of New York under the direction of archaeologist Diana Wall. During the course of these excavations Wall found various artifacts, the majority of which were historic “architectural artifacts, ceramic sherds, and glass sherds” (Barrett, p. 5-6)

## **Morris-Jumel Mansion**

In 2000, Linda Stone conducted archaeological monitoring of the installation of the fire suppression sprinkler system at the Morris Jumel Mansion. Most of her findings involved trenches consisting of fill, but she noted finding one possible prehistoric artifact that may have been a piece of a tool. She also makes note in her report that previous excavations in Roger Morris Park have uncovered prehistoric remains, and recommends that future excavations occur in the location of the previously excavated trenches (Stone, p.22).

Emergency cultural resource monitoring was done in the park by Alyssa Loorya and Christopher Ricciardi in 2005. They monitored the installation of a new drain pipe in the retaining wall. They did not find anything of significance and believe that monitoring in this specific area is no longer necessary due to its compromised nature due to previous construction on it (Loorya, 7).

In 1994, Arnold Pickman conducted archaeological investigations in reference to a foundation waterproofing project at the Mansion. Pickman's testing and monitoring "indicated the presence of two previously undocumented cobble walkways extending east and west of the "hyphen" portion of the Morris Jumel Mansion" thought to be constructed in the later 19<sup>th</sup> century.(Pickman, p.91) Other architectural artifacts were found, including remains of a flagpole, and fill dating to the period of occupation for the mansion.

In 1986, Susan A. Dublin and Nan Rothschild conducted an archaeological investigation at the Morris-Jumel Mansion. The results of which can be found in "A Report On The Archeological Investigation At The Morris-Jumel Mansion."

## **Queens County Farm Museum**

In 1993, Arnold Pickman conducted an “Archaeological and Historical Study of the Adriance Farm Park.” He identified a cobble path to the immediate south of the farmhouse, determined that much of the area located near the current roadway has been disturbed, found various historical artifacts that date to the pre-Creedmor era, as well as prehistoric artifacts. Due to his findings he believes the area should be studied further.

## **Van Cortlandt Manor**

In 1987 Louis Berger Associates monitored installation of sewage and plumbing lines at the Van Cortlandt Manor. They did not find anything significant in the trenches, and noting that what they did find was displaced.

In the 1990’s the Brooklyn College Archaeological Field School under the direction of archaeologists Drs. H. Arthur Bankoff and Frederick A. Winters conducted various digs at the manor. They found various artifacts that date to the occupation of the house.

## **Wyckoff House**

Since the 1970’s various excavations have occurred at the Wyckoff House both within the basement and the surrounding areas. There have been many cultural remains found ranging in date from the 17<sup>th</sup> century to the present.

## **The Houses**

Many of the houses still have potential archaeological significance with the exclusion of the houses that have been moved from their original locations and specific disturbed areas.

However, many of the disturbed areas could potentially be archaeologically significant if future excavations were deeper. Most of the archaeologists recommend continued study and monitoring of the houses and their surrounding areas, and the author agrees.

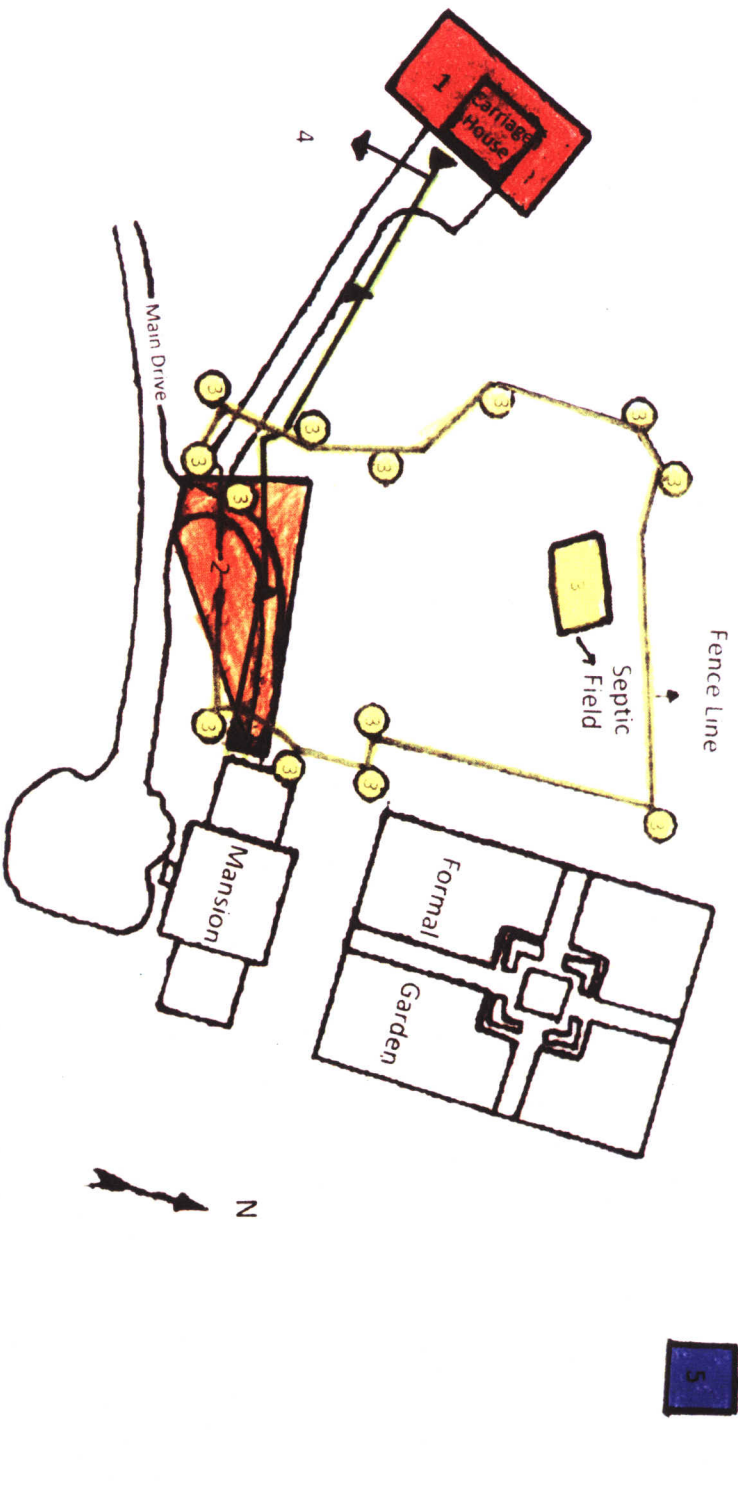


Figure 2: Bartow-Pell Mansion Archaeological Excavations Map (Rough Draft)

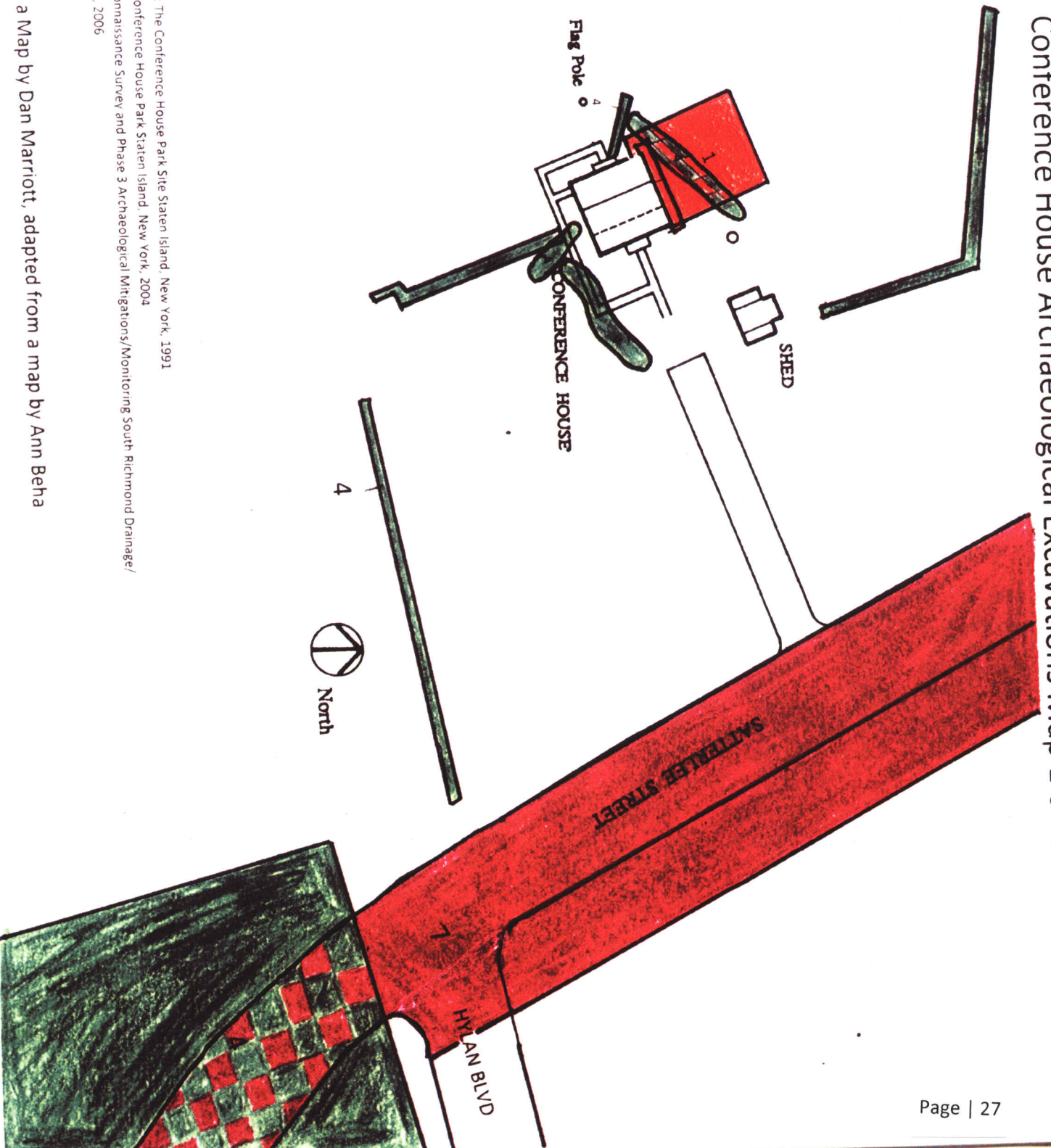


Figure 3: Conference House Archaeological Excavations Map 1 of 2 (Rough Draft)

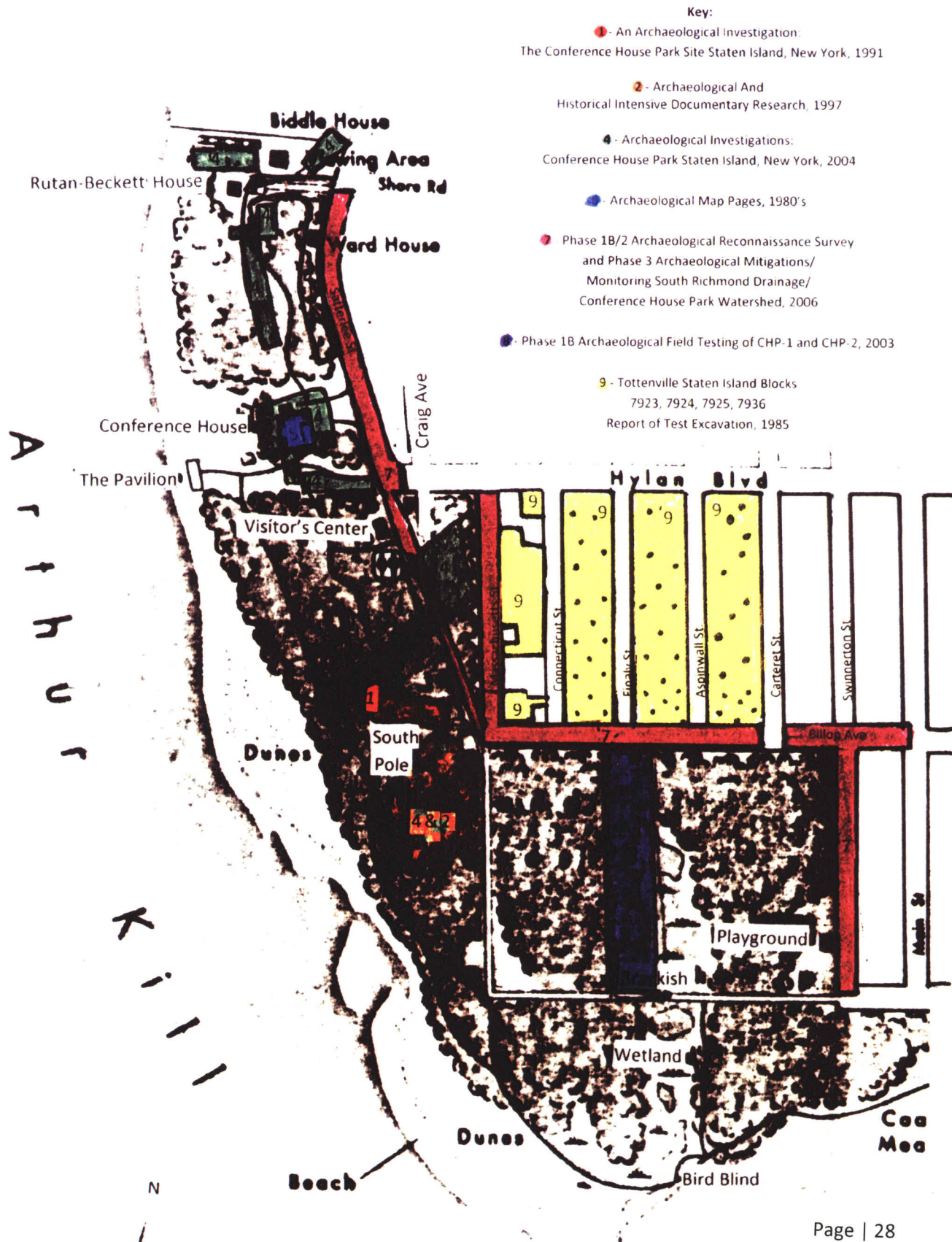
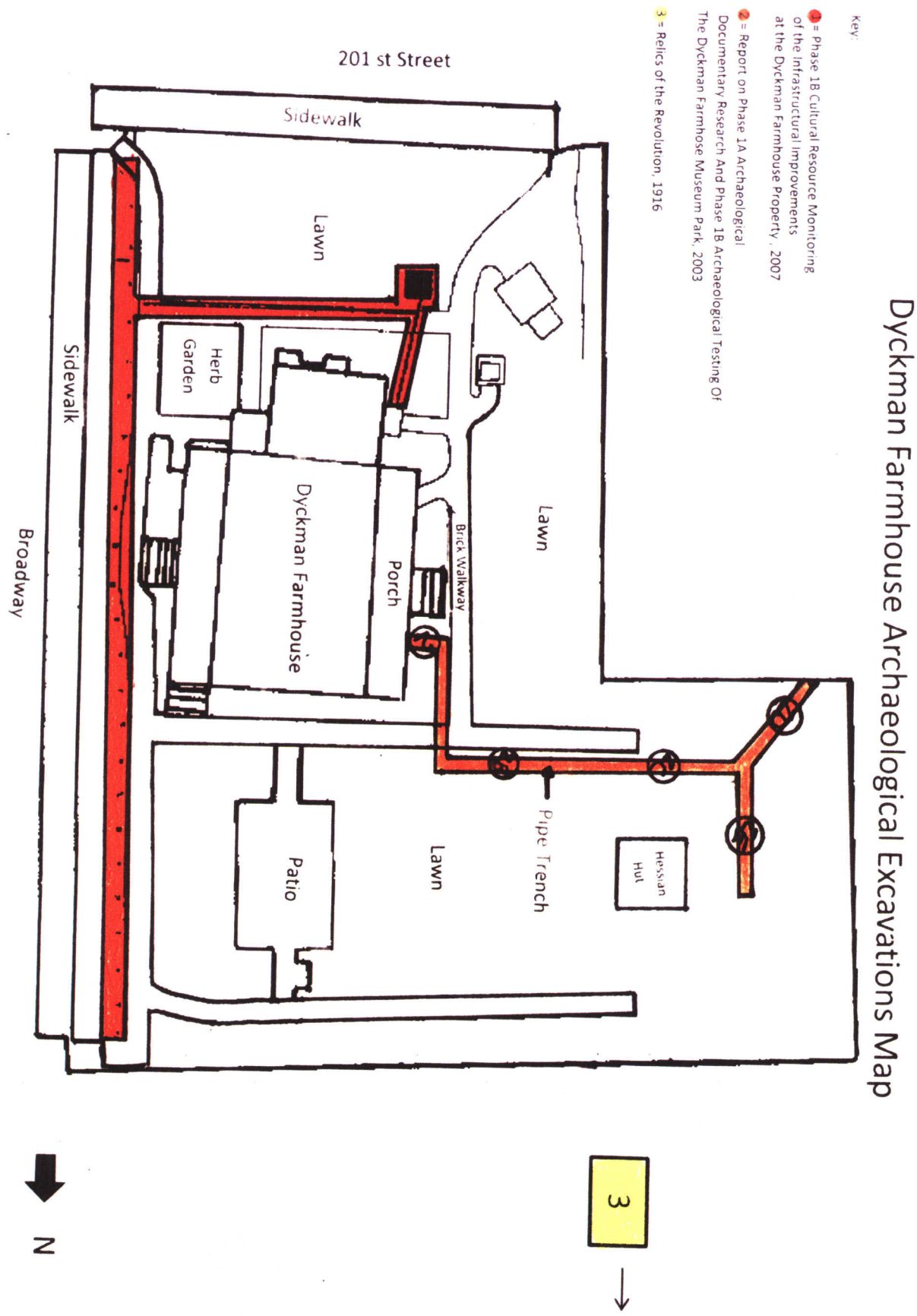




Figure 5: Dyckman Farmhouse Archaeological Excavations Map (Rough Draft)

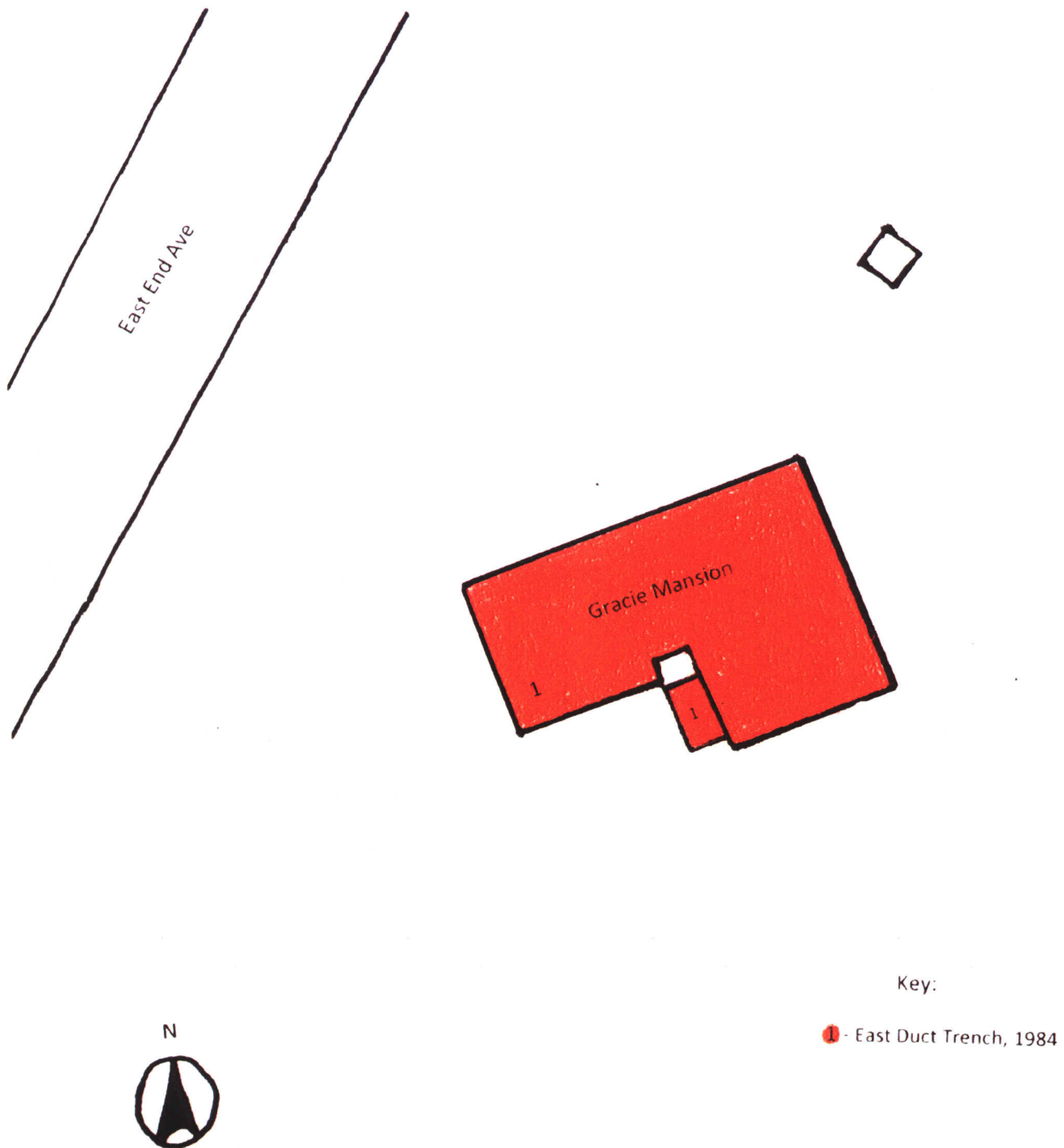


Figure 7: King Manor Archaeological Excavations Map (Rough Draft)

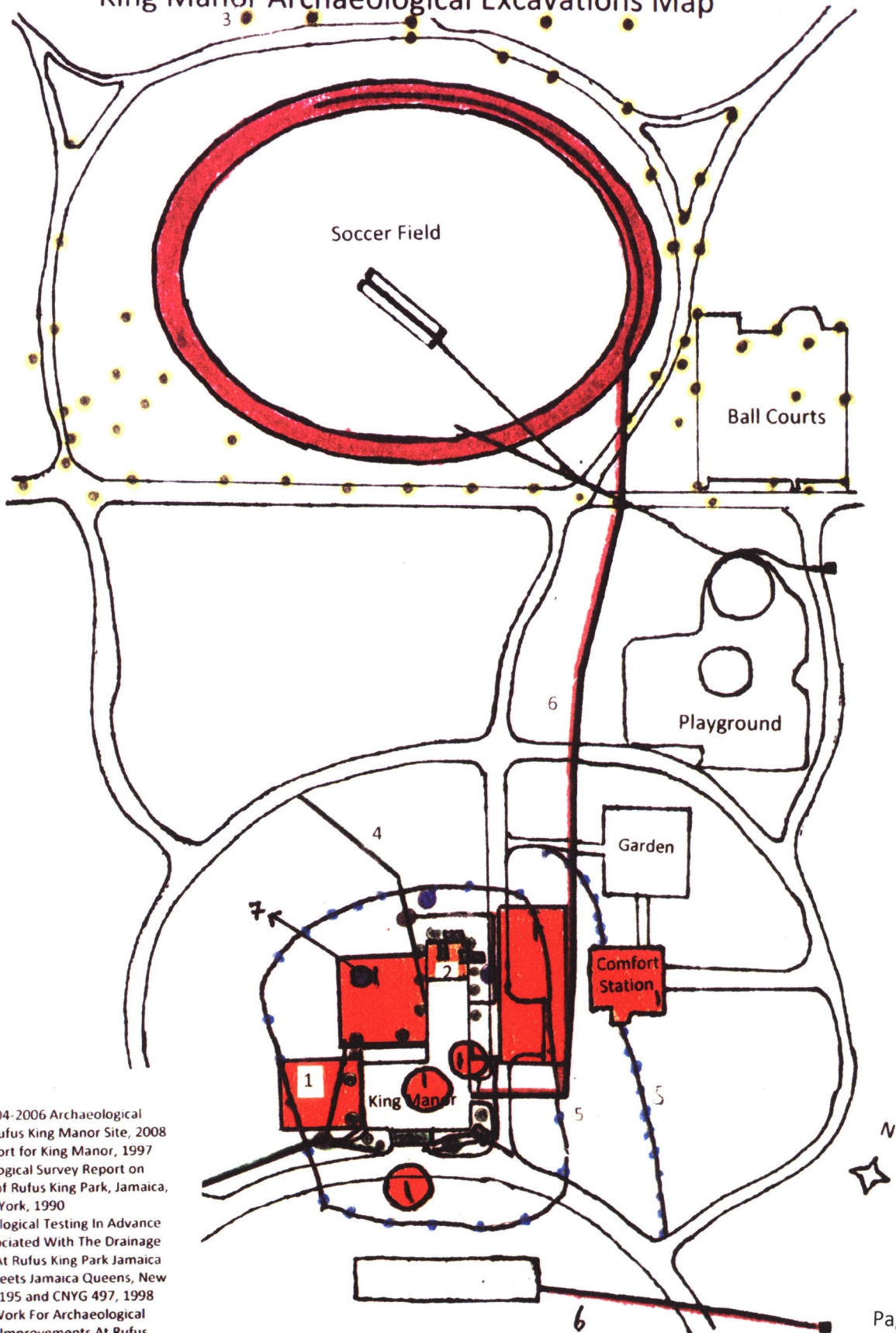
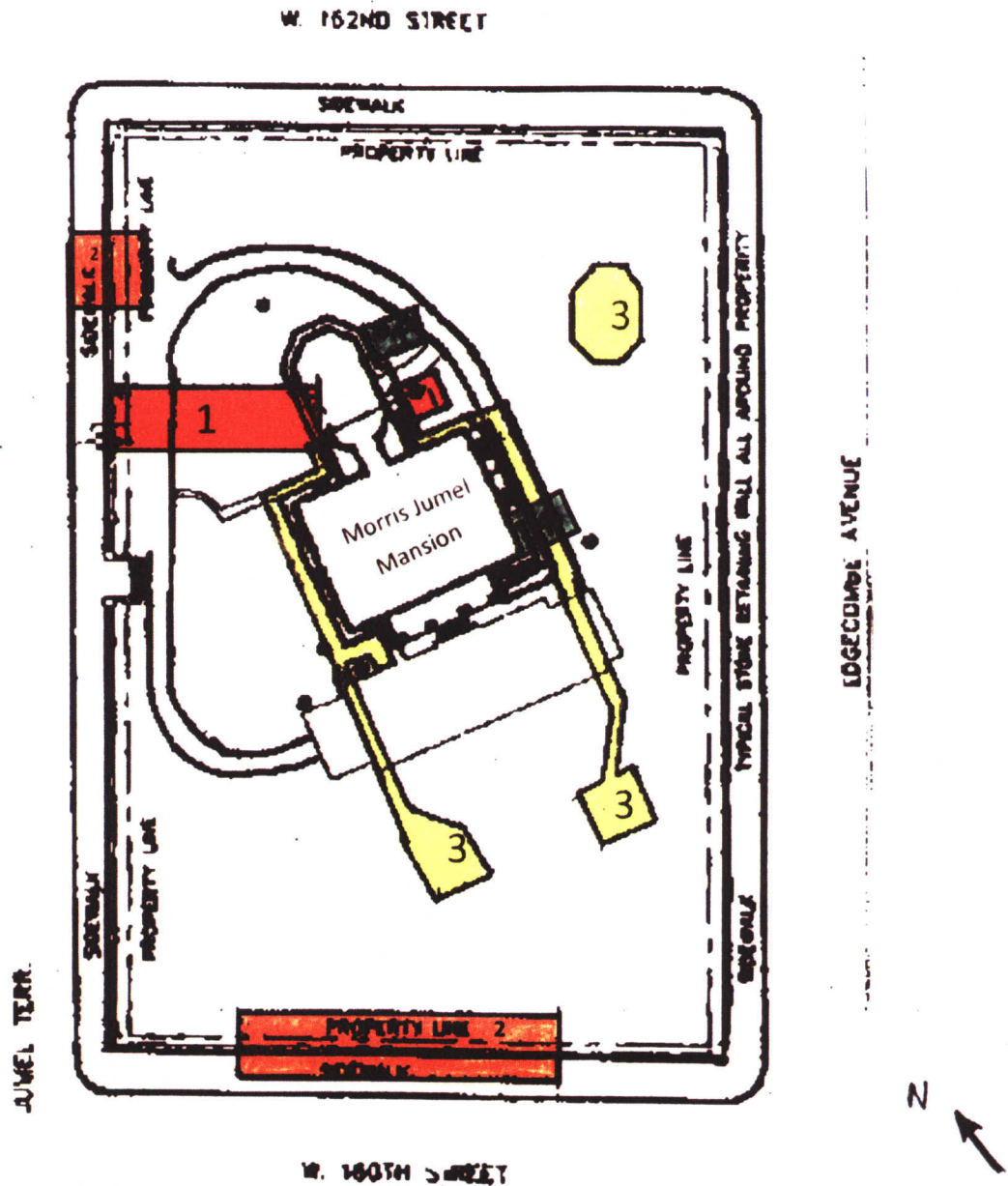


Figure 8: Morris-Jumel Mansion Archaeological Excavations Map (Rough Draft)

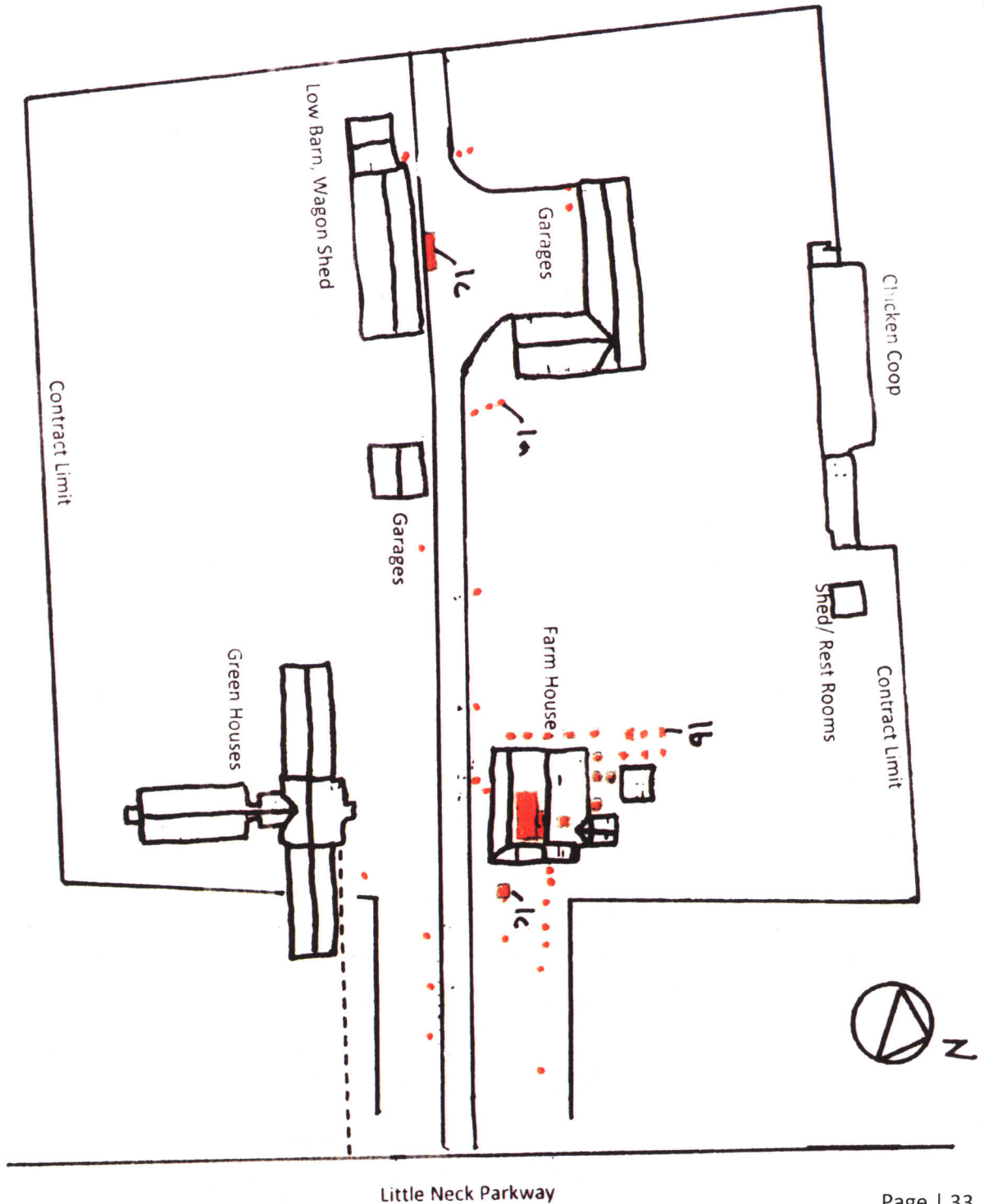


Figure 9: Queens County Farm Museum Archaeological Excavations Map (Rough Draft)

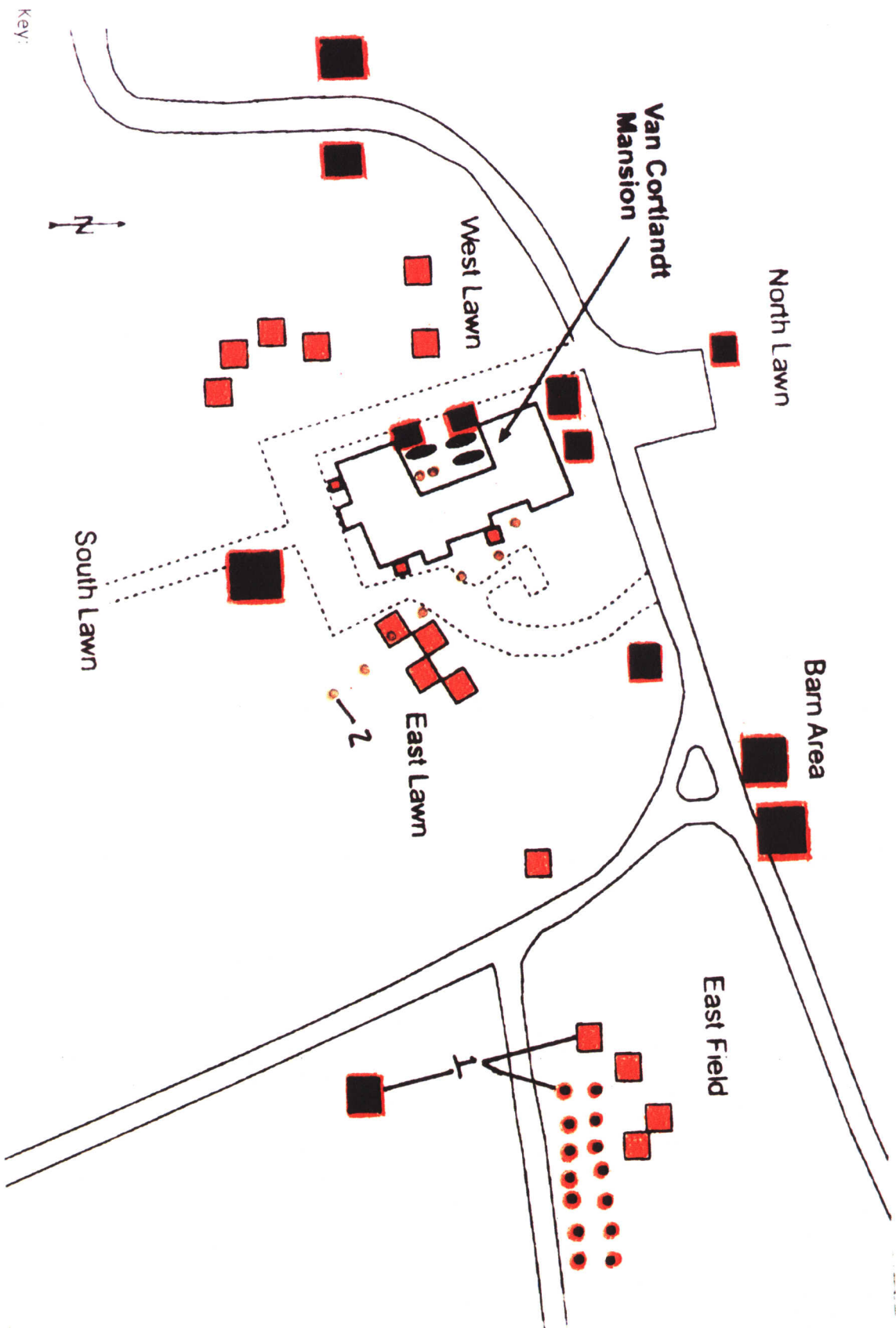


Figure 11: Wyckoff House Archaeological Excavations Map (Rough Draft)

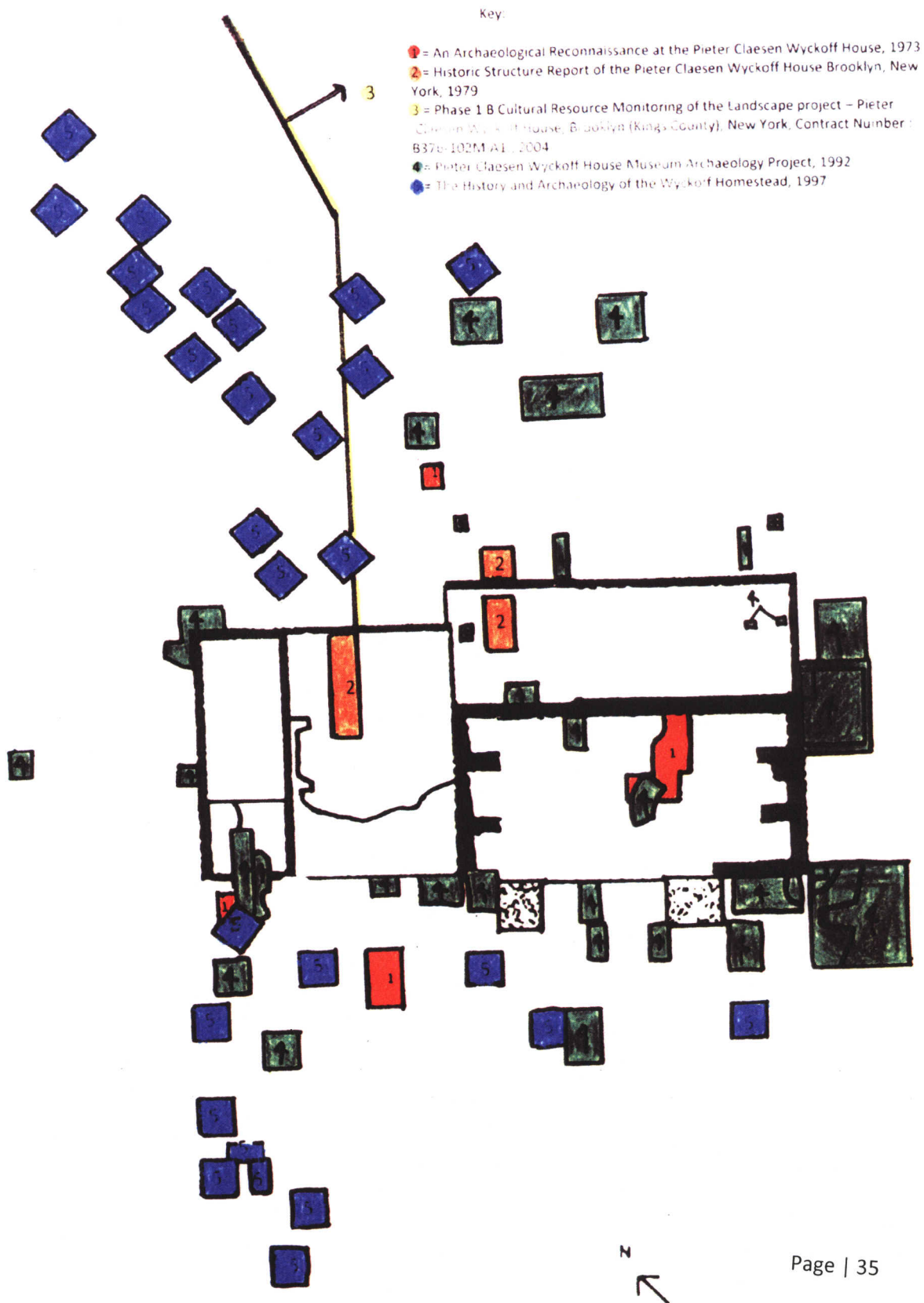


Figure 12: Suggested Database Organization

Figure 2B: Chart of the Percentage of Documents by House

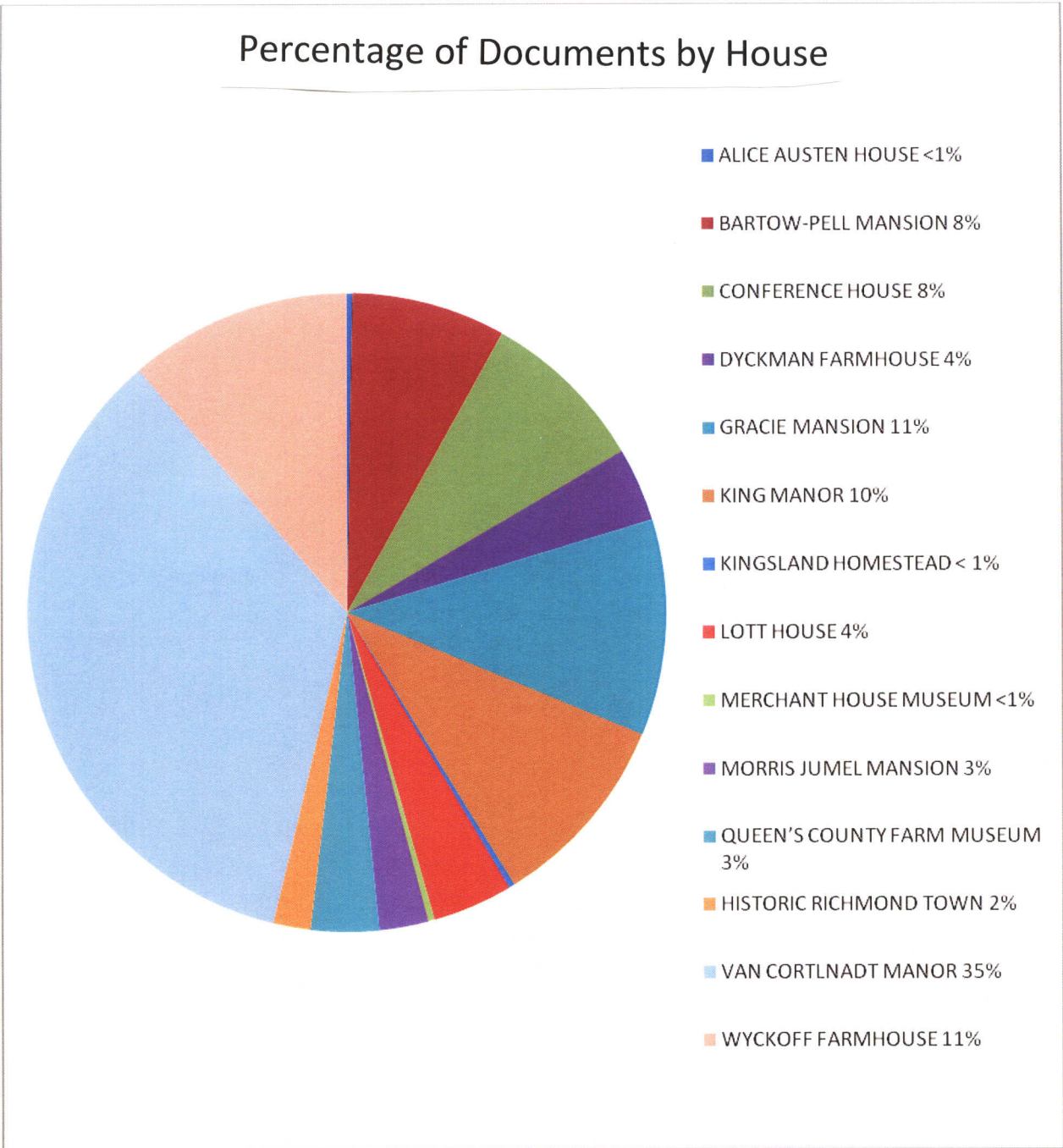
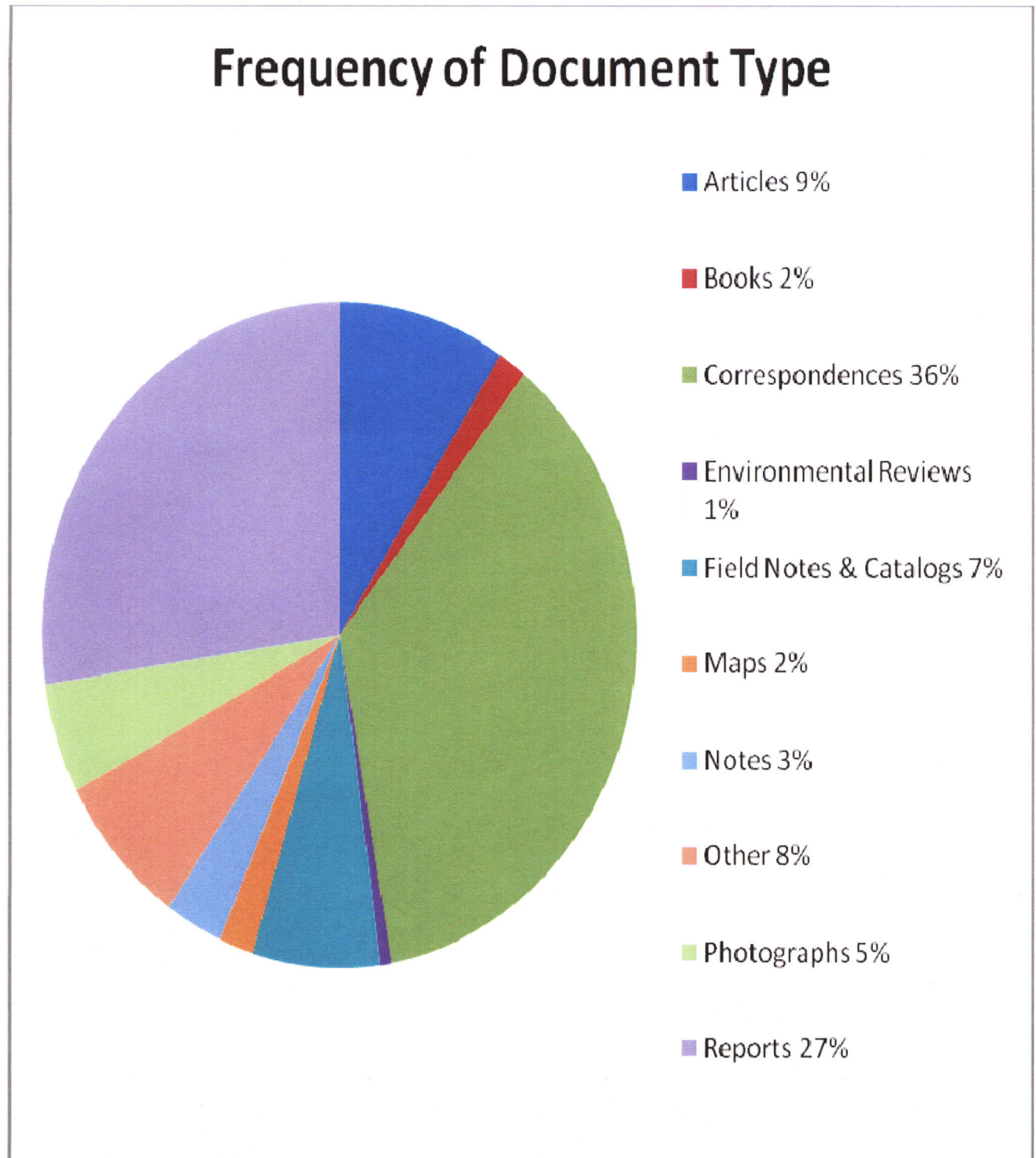


Figure 3B: Table of Document Type Frequency
