## *Sarah Carroll*

Sarah is a life-long preservationist and native New Yorker with more than two decades of professional experience protecting historic resources in New York City. She currently serves as the Chair of the New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission, the largest municipal preservation agency in the United States. Sarah leads the agency's vision and strategies for protecting more than 36,000 architecturally, culturally and historically significant buildings and sites and for identifying and designating new landmarks and districts.



## *Jennifer J. Raab*

The longest-serving college president in the City University of New York, in 2022 Jennifer J. Raab marked her 21st anniversary as President of Hunter College — the largest college in the City University of New York system. Since she assumed the presidency in 2001, Hunter has significantly increased its government grants and awards and strengthened its fiscal management. Before her esteemed tenure at Hunter College, President Raab served as Chairman of the New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission from 1994 to 2001.
